Below is a schedule of the next steps in the SCCDP:

## 2012

**Ongoing:** Work with Scotlandville community, Metro Council members and other interested groups to build consensus, to develop advocates that will embrace the plan and follow it through implementation:

- Create the Scotlandville Review Board (SRB) with an Advisory Committee to monitor the implementation of the SCCDP, and have the SRB appoint the Executive Director for the establishment of the Scotlandville Community Development Partnership (SCDP), to manage the implementation of the SCCDP;
- Develop Community Benefits Agreements (CBA) for private-public development projects, to ensure that economic development projects benefit the local community;
- Update the SCCDP every three to five years to reflect changing conditions in the community.

BRPCC is a Federally Qualified Health Center, and provides primary care and behavioral health services in the Greater Baton Rouge Area to constituents of all ages, regardless of ability to pay. "Quality, affordable health care is available for everyone in Baton Rouge, regardless of ability to pay," said Dr. Patricia Melson, Chair of the Board of Directors. "We are pleased to offer our services to the Baton Rouge community, and hope that the addition of these services in the North Baton Rouge area will assure everyone of a medical home", she said.

The location of the BRPCC in the Jewel Newman Center is due to collaborative partnerships, including the Mayor's office, Councilman Ulysses "Bones" Addison, the Baton Rouge Primary Care Collaborative and local dedicated individuals. For more information, call 225-774-1120. FQHCs provide a great value for Louisiana and are an intricate part of the state's safety net. FQHCs are strategically placed in medically underserved areas for the purpose of alleviating health disparities, lowering overall health care cost through preventive and comprehensive health care and promote a culture of good healthcare with the intent of transforming successive generations through knowledge, empowerment and healthcare coordination undergirded by strong patient and physician relationships.

Heart disease, diabetes and hypertension are three (3) prevalent medical conditions in the African American Community. These three conditions contribute to over 50% of the healthcare budget. Hypertension and Diabetes are the two (2) leading conditions treated at Baton Rouge Primary Care Collaborative. Chronic Renal Failure and Dialysis are other major contributing factors to tremendous health care costs. Hypertension, heart disease and diabetes all contribute to Chronic Renal Failure. The next community event "Hill Visit Day", will take place **Thursday, March 22, 2012**, where they will be meeting with Congressional Leaders and conduct blood pressure glucose and cholesterol screenings along with distributing health education literature.
