On Tuesday October, 26, 2010 the U+R CDRC began the first of three feedback sessions at the Scotlandville Public Library. Over fifty (50) residents, including State

Representatives Regina Barrow and Michael Jackson, along with April Hawthorne (legislative aid to Senator Broome), were present to hear the presentations of the concepts for the Scotlandville Comprehensive Community Development Plan (SCCDP). After the presentations the residents were asked twenty-seven (27) questions to gain their input on the best and worst aspects of the concepts. The information gathered from the three feedback sessions, called the "Feedback Tour", along with the information from the community needs survey and business survey, will be used to produce one concept that will be further developed during the Scotlandville Community Design Charrette, **November 16-20, 2010** at Southern University School of Architecture.
