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### NEXT STEPS

Below is a schedule of the next steps in the SCCDP:

#### 2011

**Ongoing:** Work with Scotlandville community, Metro Council members and other interested groups to build consensus, to develop advocates that will embrace the plan and follow it through implementation:

- Develop the Scotlandville Community Development Partnership (SCDP), to manage the implementation of the SCCDP and create the Scotlandville Review Board (SRB) with an Advisory Committee to monitor the implementation of the SCCDP;
- Develop Community Benefits Agreements (CBA) for private-public development projects, to ensure that economic development projects benefit the local community;
- Update the SCCDP every three to five years to reflect changing conditions in the community.

### SMALL BUSINESS TRAINING PROGRAM

On Thursday August 4, the Baton Rouge Black Chamber of Commerce and Sable International with assistance from the Southern University School of Architecture and its Urban + Rural Community Design Research Center (U+R CDRC), held a small business training program for local Scotlandville businesses. The meeting was held at the Spring Hill Suites at 7980 Howell Blvd., in Howell Place. 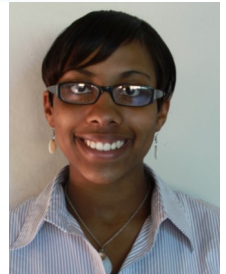
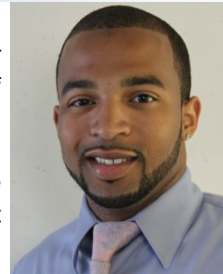

As discussed in the last issue (July 2011), Senator Yvonne Dorsey (pictured to the right), made available legislative funding through ACT 41 in the amount of \$10,000 to the Southern University School of Architecture to be used in making several homes in Scotlandville more energy efficient. This donation will assist in the implementation of the Scotlandville Comprehensive Community Development Plan (SCCDP). The Environmental Issues Plan Element of the SCCDP addresses this concern. This month the faculty and staff of the U+R CDRC will develop the selection process and meet with Senator Dorsey and her staff to discuss this process.
